Canadian vaulters, lungers and horse owners must be members of their provincial vaulting association and must have an Equestrian Canada Bronze sport license or higher and third party liability insurance provided through membership in their provincial sports organization. Memberships must be in place by the entry deadline.

Canadian vaulters entered only in Walk D Under 10 or Fundamentals DO NOT NEED a sport license but must be members of their provincial vaulting association and their provincial sports organization.

American vaulters and lungers must be members of the American Vaulting Association.

Membership numbers must be submitted with your entries. Any vaulter who does not have the correct memberships by the Deadline of **July 19 2018** will be scratched.

WAIVERS AND RELEASE FORMS

Provincial championship titles shall be awarded to individuals, pairs and teams in the following divisions:

Walk B

Trot B

Canter B - Junior & Senior

Canter A- Junior & Senior

Canter AA

In addition, individual Zone Championship titles shall be awarded to the vaulter with the highest overall score in each of the Zone established by the provincial sport organization. If there is no eligible vaulter in Division C Canter in a zone then the title shall be awarded to the vaulter with the highest overall score in Division D Canter.

In each Provincial & Zone championship classes a Reserve Champion title shall be awarded to the vaulter/pair/team with the second highest overall score.

Junior & Senior age categories are established by the FEI rules.

In order to receive a championship or reserve championship title the vaulter/pair/team must have completed all of the required rounds for the class

Equestrian Canada Statement of Principles

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities

Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;

Ensuring that owners, trainers and competitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;

Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;

Providing current information on Code of Practice for the care and handling of equines and their equine health and welfare initiatives.

Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;

Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;

Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

Right to refuse an entry:

The show committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, as per article A603.2.b.

This competition is a family-oriented event. All vaulters and coaches should ensure that music selections, should they contain vocals, are appropriate for an all-ages audience.

NOTE: Back-up Music CD's/sticks are to be delivered to the Show Office during club check-in.

All horses entered in the bronze level show require only vaccine certificates. (No Digital Horse Recordings Required)

For American horses in Canter A and AA, an affidavit for foreign-owned horses must be completed. There is no charge for this.

"Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location." (A602.5)

All horses entered at the Bronze Sanctioned Show; \$3.50. Will be included in the stalling fee.

All competing horses will be issued a show number that must be worn and visible, on the right hand side of bridle or halter, whenever the horse leaves the stable area. Failure to wear this number in schooling arenas, exercise and competition arena's, or while in transit from stabling area to these arena's, can/or may disqualify the horse from the competition.

Rules

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

A time schedule for riding and arena use will be supplied to each club at check in. When warming up, training or exercising horses under saddle, riding must only be in a designated riding ring. Suitable footwear and properly fitted, securely fastened ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved protective headgear must be worn.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned

competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)
