Statement of Principles

Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. The EC is committed to:

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. All Persons shall be committed to:

- upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare; •requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all the rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. A602.7

Memberships & Licenses

Canadian vaulters, lungers and horse owners must be members of their provincial vaulting association and must have an Equine Canada bronze, silver or gold sport license and third party liability insurance provided through membership in their provincial sports organization.

- Canadian vaulters entered only in Barrel classes, and vaulters, lungers and horse owners entered only in FUNdamentals and/or Walk D Under 10 do not need a sport license but must be members of their provincial vaulting association and their provincial sports organization.
- Membership numbers must be submitted with your entries. Any vaulter who does not have the correct memberships by the Deadline will be scratched.

Awards

Awards 1st to 6th Place

Trophies for First place for all Championship classes

Awards attire will be strictly enforced. Clubs are required to wear Club attire if possible, no jeans that are ripped, no shorts or tank tops. NF attire is not acceptable.

Pricing

All entry fees are in CDN \$. Withdrawals or no-shows after the closing of entries will not be refunded without a Doctor's note or Vet note.

ALL CLUBS WILL BE REQUIRED TO LEAVE AN OPEN CHEQUE AT SHOW OFFICE AT CHECK IN; TO COVER ANY OUTSTANDING FEES AT THE END OF THE COMPETITION.

A CLASS CHANGE FEE OF \$10 PER CHANGE WILL BE CHARGED FOR ANY CHANGES MADE AFTER THE START OF THE FIRST CLASS WITH THE EXCEPTION OF VAULTER SCRATCHES OR HORSE BEING ELIMINATED BY JUDGE FOR SOUNDNESS ISSUES OR DANGEROUS BEHAVIOUR.

Horses & Stabling

- All horses will be required to wear a number when competing. The numbers will be provided
 by the EVABC and must be returned prior to Awards. Horse Numbers must be worn and
 visible at all times in the schooling and exercise rings as well as in the competition ring.
- **Note:** Horse owners or the person responsible must provide proof of an equine influenza vaccination within 6 months of this competition. Receipt or email from the Vet who gave the vaccination or an up to date Horse Passport with vaccinations recorded will be required.
- Note: Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
- **Note:** All horses entered must be presented at the veterinary inspection on Friday at 2:00 pm.(Vet check time is subject to change). (Green horses excluded)

VOLUNTEER TIME REQUIRED:

Vaulting competitions take a lot of work to run. To be fair, this work must be done equitably by representatives from every competing club.

CLUBS WHO DO NOT FILL 90% OF THEIR REQUIRED VOLUNTEER HOURS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SIGN UP FOR WARM UP TIME ON FRIDAY, AND CHARGED A FEE OF \$100 FOR EVERY 10% BELOW 90% OF REQUIRED JOBS.

(only 85% of job credits filled then \$100 fee, 60% of required credits filled then \$300 fee)

Clubs who do not fill their volunteer credits will not be allowed to compete until the volunteer fee is paid.

Jobs are posted online before each competition and <u>volunteers</u> need to sign up no later than 24 hours <u>BEFORE</u> the competition for jobs. **Each club is required to earn at least one job credit per competing vaulter.** (More may be required depending upon the number of vaulters competing and the level of competition.)

Jobs are typically a half-day shift. Non-vaulter volunteers are actively encouraged to take a
break from their volunteer position to watch their vaulter go if it should happen during their
shift. This means it is OK to sign up for a job when your vaulter is going if they don't need your
help to prepare for their go.
